Both Championships will be held at Truro School and the latter will be a golden opportunity for Cornish athletes to perform well on home soil.

During the past five years four Cornish athletes, Jess Hicks, Dean Scott, Annabel Gummow and Conor Robinson have all represented England Schools at the International Cross country Championships. It would be fantastic if two or three of our county athletes could gain selection to represent England in Cornwall.

Please keep this date free. It will be a grand opportunity to see athletics competition of a high standard on our own doorstep.
